-- OUR SPIRITUAL JOURNEY needs a base, a foundation. Everyone has some basis for security in life, or "roots", just as trees need roots. What is your foundation? Does it match what's happening in your world?

The government of Israel based their security in large part on containing a large group of people, and upon what worked in the past for many years. The vineyard owner in BC grew his grapes in the same lower valley for many years; then the heat rose, and he moved the vineyard further up the valley. Your car is reliable year after year, until it isn't; is it time to fix it?

How do we handle the events of our life? Do we do it on our own, or via social media, or via friends, or? Consider WHAT GIVES YOU SECURITY from this list which are the most popular [not here in any order]:

- + geography, living in a particular place, familiar surroundings, knowing your neighbors.
- + possessions, the old family home, favorite furniture or books, the old reliable car.
- + money, financial power, investments, pension-planning.
- + another person, parent, child, spouse, friend, political leader.

OK, now how many of these are your sense of security, what you base life on? All are important in our lives. We need roots. Since I moved around a lot when young I consider myself a "westerner" [and that eliminates any "old family home" for me]. My first car took me everywhere doing photography, almost new and reliable; it also had a speedometer that went to 150 – but I was told that it weighed 50 pounds at 80 mph. Limits!

Security -- a good way to test our own security is to relate it to our faith. Is there one thing which, if it were lost, would you make you feel life was not worth living? Things and places have limits, decay, destruction, accidents, loss. Or, the older relative who can't bear to give up house/possessions of a long lifetime even when it is physically impossible for them to maintain them. Or self-esteem based on money and financial power – loss of which eats into a sense of self-worth.

Look again: there is only one basis for solid unshakable security which a person needs to live a good life, and that is the security of a solid and living

faith in God. God alone can be depended on to love us, to be close, to be responsive to our needs. Jeremiah said it a long time ago:

"Blessed is the person who trusts in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. He is like a tree planted by water that sends out its roots by the stream, And does not fear when heat comes for its leaves remain green, And is not anxious in the year of drought as it does not cease to bear fruit." [Jer.17: 7-8]

If our faith is rooted deeply in God as revealed in Jesus Christ, it will be stronger than any organization, possession, structure, or other person.

It is said that we are a "covenant people" with God, in a relationship with Him. We are sure of God's love for us. We can trust his guiding hand in the now and in the future – whatever comes along. When "stuff happens", when our world is shaken, we can remember that if we try to discern God in the events of our lives, or our world, we may even be able to work with Him to accomplish what he has in mind for us.

For example, God calls on us to "love him with all our heart and soul and mind and strength and to love our neighbors as ourselves."

Because of that relationship/covenant with God, we are reconciled to God, and loved and accepted. I know who I am, where I belong, and where I am going in life – as a part of God's Family. I don't have to run after the new fad or the latest social media post.

Because of God's gift of inner security and even serenity, we need not be afraid as individuals or as the church to speak and act boldly for what we know to be right. Jesus is the model for our life-style. He demonstrated servanthood in all his actions and teachings – healing the sick, feeding the hungry, comforting the sorrowful. "Whoever would be great...must be your servant..." The servant style of life puts the concerns of others ahead of power, wealth, etc.


Come, know one another better in a sharing of mutual concern and support – through our church. Find ways together and individually to seek and do what God has in mind for us – in this changing world of ours.

Ask, what gifts do you have that you are being called to use, or share, as you do what God has in mind for you?

Pray about it; & let the Holy Spirit lead you in your journey of faith and life.

After preparing an apple infused sauce to serve with the tenderloin, he invited Audrey Hanson to assist him in the preparation of the gluten-free stuffed meat. After pounding the tenderloin, they layered spinach, asparagus, red peppers, and stuffing.

Chef John encouraged Audrey as she rolled the meat after which Chef John showed the audience how to tie the roll firmly before searing. When the meal was ready, Chef John showed the audience how to carve and plate the tenderloin.

The enthusiastic audience watched closely, asking questions throughout the presentation. The meal included appetizers of skewed tomatoes and cheese, spinach dip served with baguettes, stuffed pork tenderloin, green salad with walnuts and apples, and pineapple delight for dessert. 















