# Thanksgiving for Baptism

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the pastor begins.

- P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, by whose hand we are given new birth, by whose speaking we are given new life.
- C: Ámen.
- P: Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we are welcomed, restored, and supported as citizens of the new creation.
   Let us give thanks for the gift of baptism.
- P: Holy God, holy and merciful, holy and mighty, you are the river of life, you are the everlasting wellspring.

In mercy and might you have freed us from death and raised us with Jesus, the firstborn of the dead. In baptismal waters our old life is washed away, and in them we are born anew.

Water may be poured into the font as the pastor continues.

- P: Glory to you for oceans and lakes, for rivers and streams.
  Honor to you for waters that wash us clean, quench our thirst, and nurture both crops and creatures.
  Praise to you for the life-giving water of baptism, the outpouring of the Spirit of the new creation.
