



*The Ecumenical Mission of Strathcona County was founded in 1990. For over 30 years, a unique collaboration of member churches; including: Ardrossan United, Bethel Lutheran, Glory Lutheran, Mount Olivet Lutheran, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic, Salisbury United, Sherwood Park United and St. Thomas Anglican have gathered together for 3 1/2 days each fall season to - Worship Together, Learn Together and Grow Together in Christ. We look forward to the fall of 2022 when we gather again to celebrate our common faith in Christ. Our guest speaker at each Church will be Reverend Dr. Stephen Chambers. He has served at several Lutheran Churches, taught at Concordia Lutheran Seminary, and served as Academic Dean. He also had the opportunity to spend six seasons excavating an early Christian Church and monastery at Hippos; near Lake Tiberias (Sea of Galilee); where Jesus and his disciples walked.*
